





#### Operating Engineers and Other Construction Equipment Operators

#### What do operating engineers and other construction equipment operators do?

Operating engineers and other construction equipment operators use construction equipment like bulldozers and front-end loaders to dig, move, and grade earth; erect structures; or pour concrete. Among other duties, they may repair and maintain equipment. They typically do the following:

- Learn and follow safety regulations
- Act to avoid potential hazards or obstructions, such as utility lines, other equipment, other workers, or falling objects
- Locate underground services, such as pipes or wires, prior to beginning work
- Monitor operations to ensure that health and safety standards are met
- Move levers, push pedals, or turn valves to activate power equipment
- Drive and maneuver equipment
- Coordinate machine actions with crew members in response to hand or audio signals
- Check to make sure that fuel supplies at sites are adequate

#### What's the work environment like?

Construction equipment operators work in nearly every weather condition. Workers often get dirty, greasy, muddy, or dusty. Some operators work in remote locations on large construction projects, such as highways and dams, or in factories or mines. Construction equipment operators may have irregular hours because work on some construction projects continues around the clock or must be done late at night. Extremely cold weather or rain can stop some types of construction. Nearly all operators work full time.

#### Are my interests similar to those of operating engineers and other construction equipment operators?

The interests of operating engineers and other construction equipment operators typically match jobs that have the following characteristics:

For each occupation, the licensing authority and requirements are provided, as well as license and examination fees, and contact information for the licensing organization. Every effort has been made to ensure licensing and occupational information is as accurate as possible; however, information may be modified or deleted when changes occur in state laws.

This compilation addresses only occupational licenses that are required for individuals in particular fields and not business licenses, which are required for a particular business or establishment. 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#### **Electrical Inspector**

#### Job Description

Electrical inspectors inspect electrical installations to verify conformance with safety laws and ordinances. They inspect installations undergoing construction or remodeling to enforce laws and ordinances establishing and maintaining minimum standards for residential, commercial, and industrial electrical installations and appliances. They review electrical plans, verify loads, inspect wiring, fixtures and equipment and issue notices to repair, remove or refrain from using items found to be unsafe.






Mean Wages by Industry (2011-2012 Graduates, After 1 Year)





2014 LEAD-Business Service Reps Employer Needs Survey

- 44% of Employers Had Hiring Difficulty
- No Urban / Rural Difference
- Most Difficulties in Education,
   Construction, Health Care, Manufacturing
- Top Reasons:
  - Lack of Experience
  - Lack of Education Credentials
  - Lack of Technical / Occupational Skills
