School Quality or Student Success Indicators

Academic Indicators must have substantial more weight in the accountability model than School Quality or Student Success Indicators

English Learners
Progress

For High Schools: Graduation Rate Required; May Include Growth

For Elem/Middle: Additional Academic Indicator or Growth
